# 4. <u>SuperChems<sup>™</sup> for DIERS</u>

SuperChems<sup>TM</sup> for DIERS is an advanced digital simulation software tool for pressure relief design and is provided by ioMosaic Corporation to AIChE for license to individuals and corporations. The software is available for a one-time license acquisition fee that includes up to five users and after that, there is an annual maintenance fee. New technology updates are provided on a periodic basis. *Training for this version of SuperChems is now available*.
